I am a passionate visual storyteller with a love for shooting and editing video, as well as writing and photography. My experience with different platforms means I'm highly adaptable with a firm understanding of various modes of communicating. I have been writing scripts for online video, television and radio for more than 10 years. I am a trained radio news anchor with extensive experience in recording voice-overs and have also done pieces to camera for television

I work well under pressure and am used to tight deadlines where solid editorial judgment and excellent language skills are vital. In recent years I managed several longer term projects such as digital interactive features, documentaries and immersive storytelling and I have also spearheaded 360 video projects.

I am able to work independently to see stories and projects through from inception to broadcast, but also enjoy guiding others and managing a team on larger projects.
